


ABOUT COSTA RICA:

Costa Rica is characterized by its impressive scenic beauty, its diversity and consolidated system of National Parks and protected areas. Often considered as the "land of eternal spring" by its inhabitants, Costa Rica's mild climate is the envy of many a visitor from temperate regions. Its traditional social stability and high levels of education bring about a long lasting peaceful atmosphere. Conveniently located on the Central American isthmus, the country is bordered to the north with Nicaragua and to the south with Panama. Over 300Km of coastline are put together with the Caribbean and the Pacific.

Traveling from coast to coast is surely an entertaining journey due to the marvelous landscapes of this neotropical region. Given the topography of the area, Costa Rica can boast a wide range of microclimates and these in turn give way to great diversity in flora and fauna. Rugged highlands are found throughout most of the country, ranging from approximately 1,000 to 2,000 meters above sea level. Several active volcanoes talk about the young geological formations of this nation.

Visitors continually express, among the highlights of their trip, the friendliness and hospitality of the "Ticos". Costa Ricans are in great amount considered happy people and based on the World Health Organization, a low infant mortality rate partners with a high life expectancy rate.

Cloud Forests: These are located in the higher elevations offering a escape from the warmer climates of the low flatlands. 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BOCAS DEL TORO, PANAMA (4 DAYS / 3 NIGHTS) ET 05 B



The south Caribbean of Costa Rica makes a nice combination with the northern Panamanian archipelago of Bocas del Toro. Both destinations offer wonderful beach opportunities and snorkeling tours. Reach Bocas del Toro from the south of Costa Rica or via a local flight from San Jose and back. The Panamanian archipelago of Bocas del Toro is made up of six rainforest covered islands (only two with roads or services), "Bocas" is the ideal spot to spend a few days surrounded by nature. Snorkeling, swimming and visiting spectacular beaches perfect for sunbathing.

Day 1. to Bocas del Toro (B,L) Today we depart early for our transfer to Bocas Del Toro, a Panamanian island. Arrive in Guabito in Panama then to Finca where our boat will be waiting to take us to Isla Bocas. Our tour will begin here with a visit to the Bastimento & Zapatilla National Park for snorkelling. After lunch we transfer by boat to Isla Colon.

Day 2. Bocas del Toro (B,L) After breakfast we transfer to Drago mouth at the north part of the island, one of the most natural beauties in the area. Enjoy the sun, the beach or practice snorkeling. After lunch we return to the hotel for a free afternoon at leisure.

Day 3. Bocas del Toro/South Caribbean (B,L) After breakfast we transfer to Bastimentos National Park for a half day of snorkeling. After lunch we transfer back to the South Caribbean of Costa Rica for overnight.

Day 4. South Caribbean/San José (B) Today we transfer back to San José.





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FAQ S:

Q- Are visa and passport requirements to travel to Costa Rica?

Travelers require a valid passport to enter to Costa Rica for at least six months from their arrival day. No visa is necessary for travelers from the U.S., Canada and Western Europe. Visas are needed by certain nationalities so check ahead before traveling at Costa Rican Consulates.

Q- Can I drink the water?

Yes. The public water system provides pure, suitable and good quality water to 98 percent of the country. Water supplies are filtered and chlorinated, and the quality is controlled by the State. Available is also bottled water which you can find in every hotel, restaurant and supermarket.

Q. Are immunizations required?

Costa Rica is one of the safest destinations in the developing world, from a general health point of view. This is largely due to high health standards in our country.

There are no required immunizations for entering Costa Rica. However, it is always wise to keep up your basic shots such as tetanus and diphtheria. Risk of contracting malaria is minimal, but for itineraries that include the Caribbean lowlands, travelers might wish to take the extra precaution of a prophylactic medicine. Decisions about immunizations and anti-malarial medications should be made on a personal basis after consultation with your doctor.

Q- What taxes would I have to pay?

For the included features of your itinerary taxes have already been charged. For meals on your own the bill will come with a 13% sales tax and a 10% service tax. (Extra tipping is at your discretion.) There is a US\$26 tax upon departure that must be paid at the airport. Tips are not included in tours or transfers, and the amount depends on the service that you received. Tipping is expected.

Q- Is Costa Rica safe?

San José has increased its population very fast in the past years. Therefore you shall want to take the safety precautions you would in any populous place. Avoid tempting friends of theft. Here are a few tips for avoiding petty theft:

- 1. Make a photocopy of your passport and leave the original, your airline ticket and the bulk of your money in your hotel safe.
- 2. Change money in your hotel and ask for part of it in small bills.
- 3. Carry backpacks on your front.
- 4. Never change money in the street or flash big wads of bills.
- 5. Don't wear anything other than costume jewelry. Men, get a cheap watch for the trip.
- 6. If you are going out at night, take a taxi.
- 7. Don't leave money or valuables lying around your hotel room. Use the safe or check them in at the reception desk.

Q- What about electricity?

Electric outlets are for 110v nationwide. 97% of the country has electricity and we are proud to state that 92% of our energy comes from natural resources such as hydroelectric energy, geothermal, windmills and solar. A few very remote lodges will be provided by a generator that will be working only in specific hours.

Recommended Travel Gear

To help make your vacation as convenient and pleasant as possible, we will be sending you a list of suggested travel gear for each of the trips you book with us. Review the list and pack accordingly. Here, we suggest certain very useful tips:

-Three of the most important things to bring to Paradise are a pair of good binoculars, sunscreen and insect repellent.

-An ample supply of your favorite toiletries and health remedies are recommended for your personal comfort. Once on the road, you don't want to waste any of your valuable vacation time shopping for such items should you require them.

-Casual clothing: shirts (cotton or light synthetic, long- and short-sleeved), trousers (cotton or light synthetic pants) Jeans are not recommended (too slow to dry). Hiking shorts. Footwear should be waterproof (light weight hiking shoes, river sandals), tennis shoes or running shoes. If you do not bring hiking boots we recommend you bring TWO pairs of tennis shoes, specially in the rainy season May – Nov.
